- 7. How many of the 5-days training is face to face? Online? 2 days training some participants will join virtually; others will attend as in-person.

- 9. How many trainings to be conducted? 1 cohort spread over 2 days
- 10. Scope mentions that the training needs to be provided for 20 participants for 5 days. Please confirm if this is the only training to be provided? Yes, but for 2 days
- 11. Scope mentions In person and virtual sessions. If we need to provide only one in person training of 5 days to 20 participants, please let us know the need for virtual sessions- the training needs for the virtual attendees are the same as in-person attendees. Some attendees will join the training virtually, this should be scoped in the plan.
